

RULES AND CONDITIONS

1. The committee reserve the right to cancel or alter the order of events.
2. The committee reserve the right to refuse entry.
3. The committee and landowners will not be responsible for any injuries arising from accidents to persons or animals, or theft of properties on the grounds during the course of the event.
4. The Judge's and Committee's decision shall be final on all matters during the event.
5. Any objections are to be handed to the Secretary in writing within half an hour of the event with a deposit of £20 to be forfeited if the objection is not upheld.
6. The Committee reserve the right to cancel or amend any class, refuse entry or to disqualify any animal which in their opinion is not fit to compete.
7. This showground is kindly lent to us; the show is run entirely by volunteers. Anyone using unreasonable behaviour, bad language, dropping litter, mucking out onto the showground, mistreating any animal or anything else that affects the Club's reputation may be asked to leave the showground.
8. In the event of large numbers of entries and time constraints it may not be possible to hold up a class in order to wait for competitors to finish competing on other rings. Please bear this in mind when entering.
9. Hard hats to meet either PAS015, ASTM F1163, SNELL E200, SN7 3838 1998 are compulsory at all times when mounted. Body protectors are recommended for jumping.
10. All horse and ponies must be at least 4 years old to compete.
11. All dogs must be kept on leads at all times, failure to do so may result in you being asked to leave the showground.
12. All competitions to be run in accordance with current Riding Club and Mercian Rules.
13. Strictly no cantering / galloping other than in exercise rings provided.
14. The road outside the showground is very busy. It is the responsibility of everyone to ensure the main gate is kept closed after entering or leaving. It is inevitable that there will be loose horses during the day, so closing the gate is really important for road users and our horses and riders.

RING THREE – Showing

Classes 13, 15, 17, 18 & 19 - will be required to ride a short individual show to include walk, trot, canter, halt.

Class 12 - will be required to ride a short individual show to include walk, trot and halt.

Class 14 - open to all Registered and Non-Registered Natives, judged on confirmation, manners and turnout.

Class 16 - judged on manners and suitability to be a riding club all-rounder. Will include a small jump.

9.30am prompt

- Class 11 Best Turned Out (to be split horses / ponies if entries warrant). Judged on turnout only.
- Class 12 Lead Rein
- Class 13 First Ridden
- Class 14 Mountain & Moorland (to be split small / large breed if entries warrant)
- Class 15 Ridden Coloured. Open to any Palomino, Dun, Piebald, Skewbald, Spotted. To be judged on evenness of colour or markings, manners, turnout and condition
- Class 16 Riding Club Horse / Pony (to be split horses / ponies if entries warrant). To be ridden in a snaffle bridle.
- Class 17 Ridden Arab (pure, part bred and Anglo. May need to show proof of breeding).
- Class 18 Riding Horse over 15hh.
- Class 19 Racehorse to Riding horse. Must have raced or been in training, racing blemishes not to be penalised.
- Class 20 Veteran 15 years and over. Ridden or in-hand, to be judged on condition and well being. Three tier rosette to best over 20 years.

The championship for Ring 3 will take place immediately after Class 20 for all who have been placed first and second in Classes 11 - 20. The Champion and Reserve Champion from Rings 3 and 4 will be asked to go forward for the judging of the Supreme Showing Champion in Ring 3.
